ESSENTIAL KNOWLEDGE: THE IDAHO EARLY LEARNING EGUIDELINES ARE A RESOURCE DESIGNED TO ASSIST IN GUIDING CHILDREN'S DEVELOPMENT AND LEARNING

Seek medical or developmental expertise if concerned about a child's learning and development. (Early Learning eGuidelines, ELeG, Essential Practice, Health and Safety)

What does this look like in practice?

- Access professional resources such as the Early Learning eGuidelines to guide adult practice.

ESSENTIAL KNOWLEDGE: THE IDAHO EARLY LEARNING EGUIDELINES ARE A FOUNDATIONAL RESOURCE DOCUMENT WHICH CAN BE UTILIZED IN SEVERAL DIFFERENT WAYS

Children are supported by the greater community. Children are regarded and respected as unique, competent individuals who have individual temperaments, learning styles, home environments, cultures, and ways of understanding. Families' and children's health and well-being is a community priority. The community supports children's growth with high quality early learning and development opportunities. (ELeG, Guiding Principles)

What does this look like in practice?

- Providers use the Early Learning eGuidelines for classroom strategies and to research child development and child behavior.
- Providers use the Early Learning Supplemental Materials: In the Preschool Classroom; Caring for Idaho's Infants and Toddlers: Resources for Parents and Caregivers; and the Developmental Growth Matrix guide and inform practice.
