

Online Training Instructions Recognizing and Reporting Child Abuse and Neglect 2 Training Hours

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

- Define the term "mandated reporter" and identify the responsibilities associated with being a mandated reporter.
- Recognize signs and symptoms of child abuse and neglect.
- Plan to manage, document, and report suspected maltreatment of a child.
- Embed protective factors to prevent or respond to child abuse and neglect through a strength-based lens.

 - 2. Think of a time you were concerned about a child's safety and wellbeing. Do you feel confident that you handled it appropriately?
 - a. If not, what would you do differently knowing what you do now?
 - 3. Recognizing that compassion fatigue is real, identify a strategy you can intentionally increase in your life to take care of yourself.
